## Aidspan Issues Second Edition of Its Beginner's Guide to the Global Fund

The English-language version of “A Beginner’s Guide to the Global Fund – 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition” is now available at [www.aidspan.org/guides](http://www.aidspan.org/guides). The guide is designed to provide a broad introduction to the Global Fund for people who have little or no prior experience of the Fund, including new members of country coordinating mechanisms (CCMs), new principal recipients (PRs), new sub-recipients (SRs) – or new staff in existing PRs and SRs – as well as government officials, NGOs, donors, and journalists who report on the Fund.
